Our achievements

Since MWRRG began in 2014, we have led major initiatives to minimise waste and maximise resource recovery in metropolitan Melbourne.



We supported all 31 Councils to move towards a circular economy with 100% completing draft transition plans to deliver *Recycling Victoria* kerbside reforms.



Managed 28 contracts for 31 councils worth over half a billion dollars.



Secured \$65m state of the art composting facility through a collaborative contract for 8 councils. 120,000 tonnes food and green waste processing capacity annually – cutting emissions by 85%.



Since 2017-18 our contracts have managed 3,300,000+ tonnes of waste and diverted:

- 164,000+ tonnes of recycling
- 1,300,000 tonnes of food and green waste from landfill.

Major procurements for councils:

- 1 landfill
- 2 organics composting
- 1 recycling

4 plans for waste and resource recovery hubs of state importance.



Commercial and industrial waste:

- 433 compositional waste audits
- funded 7 partnership projects, potentially diverting 17,000+ tonnes of waste
- 1 food waste recycling guide for business.




Back to Earth Initiative reached 30 councils, 218 schools, early learning centres and community groups to encourage residents to use their green bin correctly.
